

**West Vincent Township  
Board of Supervisors Meeting**

**March 16, 2009      9:00 AM**

Attendance: Chairman Kenneth Miller, Barry DiLibero, Steve Siana of Siana, Bellwoar & McAndrew, LLP Township Solicitor, Township Manager Jim Wendelgass, Ken Yerger of Carroll Engineering, Township Engineer, Sandra Cantrell-Edwards, Zoning Officer and Township Secretary Tammy Swavely.

Chairman Miller called the meeting to order at 9:05 AM.

The **minutes of February 17, 2009** were unanimously approved on a motion by Miller and a second by DiLibero.

**Reports:**

Township Building: No Report.

Township Manager Report: The Township Manager Report for the week ending 3/7/09 was acknowledged as submitted. DiLibero asked about the damage done to the spray heads at the Weatherstone. Wendelgass stated that now that the weather has warmed up they were inspected and two spray heads and a number of plastic flow regulators that broke and the total repair cost is under \$200.00. Hankin still has a maintenance bond in effect for that facility. Wendelgass informed the Board that he will be attending a meeting in Chester County on their proposal on mosquito control for 2009.

Active Subdivision List: There are no pending deadlines.

Police Report: The police report for the month of February 2009 was presented by Police Chief Mike Swinger and was acknowledged as received.

Bills List: The Bills List was reviewed. DiLibero made the motion to approve the Bills List dated 3/13/09 in the total amount \$19,523.49. Miller seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

**Correspondence:**

A letter was acknowledged received from Nicole Lewis, National Multiple Sclerosis Society dated 3/11/09 regarding the 22<sup>nd</sup> Annual Bike Ride that goes through West Vincent Township. The Police Department provides help at road crossings where needed.

**Old Business:**

The Fee Schedule has been revised to reflect the Park and Recreation Committees recommendation to charge for the fields at Andrew Evans Park in Matthews Meadows. DiLibero made the motion that the Board adopt Resolution 10-2009 reflecting a change to the miscellaneous fees to include a \$25.00 fee per a 2-hour time slot. Miller seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

The 2009 Road Material Bids were opened at the last Board of Supervisors Meeting on March 9, 2009. They have been reviewed by the Road Master and the Township Manager and the following are the results of the lowest bidder:

DiLibero made the motion to accept the bids as submitted. Miller seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

**Business from the floor:**

Sara Shick, Planning Commission Member, asked the Board what it discussed with regards to the Zoning Ordinance on February 23, 2009 meeting since she was unable to attend and the minutes are not available at this time. Miller informed her that there was a finalizing discussion before it goes for advertisement. Wendelgass informed her that the final revisions are being done and it will be advertised shortly.

Shick brought up the Northern Federation of Chester County and that she attended a Chester County Planning Commission presentation on Landscapes 2. There is an effective web tool that shows different regions and how they are zoned. She spoke with Ron Bailey from the County and believes that the Township should be considering what to do with an emergency and especially considering all the pipelines that are in the Township and surrounding areas. Police Chief Swininger stated that the Police Department has had extensive training in this and there is currently a plan in place in case of emergency.

Miller stated that he has heard that Chester County might not fund the Phoenixville Area Recreational Plan due to budget constraints. At this time the State Senators Andrew Dinniman and John Rafferty still might have funds to contribute towards the Plan. DiLibero made a motion to adjourn, Miller seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.
