RULES AND POLICIES

Fellowship Garden, West Vincent Township



GARDENING COURTESY

One of the main goals in community gardening is to work together or next to each other in relative harmony. Please be courteous in all interactions, and work together to resolve any disagreements. Contact the Garden Committee for guideline clarifications. In the spirit of cooperation, all gardeners should treat the garden, other gardeners, neighbors, and visitors with respect and consideration.

PLOT RESPONSIBILITY

1. Garden plots are assigned to one person only and are not transferable. Others may garden at your site, but the responsibility for payment of fees, cleanup and other duties at the site will be the responsibility of the individual whose name is assigned to the plot. It is also their responsibility to make sure anyone working in their plot knows and adheres to the rules of the garden.
2. Keep the Garden Committee advised of your current address, email address, and telephone number and notify the Garden Committee of any change in your contact information. Please notify the Garden Committee if you are no longer able to tend your plot, must be absent for an extended period or have asked a friend to tend your garden for a long period of time.
3. Gardeners must maintain plots and adjacent walkways. Gardens will be kept free of weeds, rotting vegetables and trash.
4. Gardeners will not plant, weed, water or harvest from any other member's plot unless specifically invited to do so. Only the gardener assigned to a plot can grant permission. Do not borrow tools unless permission has been granted.
5. Vegetables, herbs, flowers, and small fruit plants for home consumption and donation are appropriate for planting. Perennial crops and herbs as well as annual winter hardy crops may be over-wintered, but should be maintained by the plot owner. Large bushes and perennial plants, trees or landscape plants are not appropriate in the community garden. Gardeners should take care with spreading plants to keep them confined to their plot.
6. At the end of the growing season, each member must remove all dead plants, weeds and stakes from the plot.

7. Gardeners should not allow anything taller than 8' in their plot. Do not plant or erect structures that shade or in any way impede the growth in neighbors' plots. Gardeners will not allow plants to grow over the pathways. Leave adequate space for plant growth.
8. Gardeners should be careful while watering to keep hoses out of neighboring garden plots. Good water conservation practices include using a hand-held hose end sprinkler, rather than an open-ended hose. No sprinklers allowed. Each gardener is responsible for coiling hoses after water use and double checking that the water is turned off.
9. Gardeners should make sure the gate is secure, tools are put away neatly and that trash is removed when leaving the garden.

GENERAL USE OF THE GARDEN

1. The Township's Rules and Regulations for Parks applies to the Community Garden
2. Family members are welcome to visit the garden site. Children are welcome at the garden when accompanied and fully supervised by an adult. Teach young children to stay on paths and to respect other garden member's plots and property.
3. No pets in the garden.
4. Radios should be used with headphones only.
5. No illegal substances allowed in the garden.
6. A bulletin board will be available for garden member's use. Check here for garden announcements from the gardening committee.
7. There will be communal garden work days, opening and closing work sessions and community garden meetings. Members are encouraged to attend and participate as much as possible.

TOOLS

1. Some communal tools will be available for all gardener's use. Members may use them on a first-come, first-served basis. Please return tools to the shed promptly so that other gardeners may use them. Communal garden tools should never be removed from the garden.
2. Members who wish to share their tools may keep them in the shed. Members who don't want to share their tools should store them neatly in their own garden plot. All tools should be clearly marked with a member's name. No tools should ever be borrowed from another garden plot without express permission.

SOIL AMMENDEMENTS AND DISEASE/INSECT CONTROL

A soil sample has been taken and tested by PSU Agricultural Extension. The results will be posted for the use of garden members. The garden is to be kept organic and members are asked to adhere to this policy. Please contact your garden committee if you need clarification or advice on organic gardening practices.

Below is a list of gardening soil amendments that are generally considered an organic source of nutrients. You can use them in your vegetable garden directly or in composted form:

alfalfa	fish fertilizer	manure	tea grounds
bark	grass clippings	peat moss	wood ash
blood meal	greensand	phosphate rock	wood chips
bone meal	hay or straw	potash rock	
coffee grounds	kitchen scraps	sawdust	
dolomite lime	leaves	seaweed	

Several organic insecticides are available for use by vegetable gardeners. Please contact the committee for some ideas.

COMPOST AND TRASH

1. Each gardener is responsible for trash removal.
2. There will be a compost pile available for plant waste. The compost pile should only be used for plant materials. No trash please. Do not put plant material with diseases, insect infestations, or weed seeds in the compost pile. Please carry these items out as trash.

FEES

The annual fee for a garden plot will be due by opening day in the spring. Checks should be made out to West Vincent Township. The fee is non-refundable.
